First-year student residence halls are located on the University of Utah's campus. Chapel Glen, Gateway Heights, Sage Point, Officers Circle, and Benchmark Plaza are located within Heritage Commons. Kahlert Village, Lassonde Studios, and the Impact & Prosperity Epicenter are located on lower campus. When you complete the housing application, there is a non-refundable, one-time application fee of \$130. When you reserve a room, there is a \$200 reservation fee that is applied toward first month's rent. Students new to the University must submit an enrollment deposit prior to applying for housing. **Prices are per person.** 

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Suite-style rooms feature two bedrooms connected by a bathroom. Super Double rooms are limited in number and are not available for room selection.

#### **STUDENT ENGAGEMENT FEE - \$66.00 PER YEAR**

Fee to support the Residence Hall Association (RHA) and student engagement programming across campus. Dues are added to your account at the beginning of each semester. Dues are non-refundable and mandatory.

#### **LLC PROGRAMMING FEE - \$34.00 PER YEAR**

Living Learning Community residents pay an additional \$34 in programming dues each year to support activities in these communities.



#### 2025-2026 ACADEMIC YEAR CONTRACT

**August 1** Students billed for Fall Semester

**August 1-August 11**(pre-occupancy) \$200 Reservation fee forfeited + \$1,300 cancellation fee (\$1,500 total); reversal of August charges for room/dining/services

August 12-15 Fall Move-In

August 1-31 80% of remaining Fall Contract refunded + 80% of your meal cost refunded. Spring fees will not be charged

September 1-30 60% of remaining Fall Contract refunded + 60% of your meal cost refunded. Spring fees will not be charged

October 1-19 40% of remaining Fall Contract refunded + 40% of your meal cost refunded. Spring fees will not be charged

On or after October 20 0% of remaining Fall Contract refunded +

0% of your meal cost refunded. Spring fees will not be charged **December 13** Fall move-out day (not returning for Spring)

January 1 Students billed for Spring Semester

**January 1-20** 80% of remaining Spring Contract refunded + 80% of your meal cost refunded

**January 2** Spring Only Move-In Day. Residence Halls re-open **January 21-February 10** 60% of remaining Spring Contract refunded + 60% of your meal cost refunded

**February 11-March 1** 40% of remaining Spring Contract refunded + 40% of your meal cost refunded

On or after March 2 0% of remaining Spring Contract refunded + 0% of your meal cost refunded

May 2 Spring Move-out day

#### **OFF SEASON**

**Early Arrival** (Available August 8-11 for fall)

Early arrival housing is only available to students who need to move in early for approved University-sponsored activities or requirements. Contact HRE for more information. You will be charged a daily rate of \$40. There is no meal service during this period. The early arrival date for the spring 2026 semester is January 1, 2026. (Note: not all areas available for early move-in.)

#### August Break (Available August 2-12, 2025)

Students are eligible to live on campus during the August break only if they are contracted for summer and fall semesters.

Residents can register in Housing U in CIS during summer for an additional fee.

May Break (Available May 3-8, 2026)

Students are eligile to live on campus during the May break only if they are contracted for spring and summer semesters. Residents can register in Housing U in CIS during summer for an additional fee.

Epicenter End-caps include a full-size bed and a mounted wall shelving.
